







Staging

For thirty years Mécanique Vivante has been making tools and staging devices which allow the company to set up just about anywhere with perfect autonomy: in urban, rural and industrial landscapes, in sites of outstanding architecture and now, with Project Nénuphar, in bodies of shallow water.

Implementation

Be it completely water-borne or encompassing the embankments and wharfs, the installation will depend on the configuration of the site and the means available.

So after a site visit, the company will draw up the outline of the show - its staging, lighting and artistic content - and the technical requirements.

The company balances artistic integrity, feasibility and budget constraints for each new project



Be it modest or ambitious, Project Nénuphar can adapt to each site and every event.





The Flotilla

The flotilla consists of 6 Nénuphars, a rowing boat and 6 semi-immerged floating platforms. It is separable, each element having an artistic or technical purpose.

A Nénuphar is a small floating autonomous navigable stage, 3m60 in diameter, which can carry artists and instruments both large and small.

The floating platforms, isolated or linked together by articulated arms, can be fixed or mobile, and can each carry 6 artists or the equivalent in equipment. The rowing boat is the stage for the guitarist.



Shallow waters in urban or natural environments
Ponds and lakes in parks and gardens - castle moats
Natural lakes - rivers - canals
Nénuphar require a minimum depth of 70cm.

They are not adapted to fast-flowing or sea water





The Sirens' Song & Nénuphar lends itself to artistic collaboration. Thanks to Mécanique Vivante's in-house composer, the company can work with musicians from all walks of life, be they professional or amateur.


Depending on the scale and ambition of the project, the existing repertoire (for choirs, opera singers, solo musicians and ensembles) can be adapted, or new pieces written to create a uniquely local event.

Synergy - community involvement



Mécanique Vivante works with local clubs and associations, dive clubs, in particular.

The participants are supervised by the company's divers ahead of time and trained to manoeuvre and guide the Nénuphars for the show. Their presence is required for rehearsals and for the final show.






Founded in 1989 by Franz Clochard, Mécanique Vivante creates hybrid machines that associate artistic invention and technological innovation and puts them on the world stage.

Amongst their flagship projects, the Musical Siren, a brand new musical instrument, developed from the air raid siren.

Partnered since 2004 by the French Ministry of Culture, the Gard Departmental Council and the Region Occitanie, the project has resulted in a seven-piece polyphonic Siren Orchestra.

With its unique orchestra, Mécanique Vivante creates unforgettable installations, itinerant parades and floating shows in every corner of the world.
